## Cornerstone at St. Nicholas Memorial Site by Dan Cessna

The State Route 28, East Ohio Street project is rapidly nearing completion – after years of construction, work is in the final stretch. Traffic is currently

shifted against the hillside to allow the completion of the final section of roadway, nearest the railroad. This current phase will conclude in November when we expect to complete the roadway and re-open all 4 lanes of traffic. At that point, final work will be completed on the walkway. Work is underway on the artwork, with glimpses of the history of this area being revealed for future generations to enjoy. This artwork, using a sandblasting technique, will feature six images, most significantly, the St. Nicholas Roman

Catholic Church, North Side. It is expected that some work on the parking area and landscaping may need to be completed in the spring, depending upon the weather of early winter. We are very pleased with how all of the work is coming together and anxiously look forward to opening the road and walkway for many to enjoy for years to come.

## Pennsystvania Historical Marker Dedication Set for Spring 2015

A Pennsylvania Historical Marker, designating St. Nicholas R.C. Croatian Church, North Side, as "The First Croatian Parish in the Western Hemisphere," will be installed and dedicated in April 2015. The marker will be

located at the edge of the memorial seating area, in the same place that the main altar of the church was situated and will be accessible by way of a sidewalk trail, that begins at the Penn Brewery parking lot.



The marker is significant to the North Side neighborhood and to all the Croatian ancestors who built the church.

A dedication ceremony is being planned by PCHF to recognize the marker that the Pennsylvania Historical and Museum Commission has awarded to PCHF in memory of St. Nicholas Church.


The marker pays tribute to all the Croatian immigrants who helped build this beautiful and unique church with their nickels, dimes, and quarters, and the sweat off their backs.

The PCHF website, www.stnicholasns.org, is continuously bringing you up-to-date news on the St. Nicholas Memorial Site, socials, banquets and other events.



## St. Nicholas 3 Bags of Gold Fund by Jack Schmitt

The 3 Bags of Gold Fund was initiated in 2009 for the purpose of helping to offset on-going PCHF expenses. The three-dollar (\$3.00) donation requested from each person of Croatian ancestry coincides with the feast day, December 6, of our patron saint and the three bags of gold St. Nicholas anonymously gave to a peasant man to help his three daughters gather a dowry and avoid being sold into slavery.

Many donors have contributed to this Fund in memory of their deceased loved ones each year. Others have sent in donations to acknowledge living, family members. Whatever your intention, this is a wonderful way to let your family know that you remember them and to pay tribute to the person, St. Nicholas.

If enough people donate only \$3.00 per Croatian in their family or as a memorial each year, PCHF can afford to: update the *www.stnicholasns.org* website; keep you informed of St. Nicholas events with our newsletters, cover Javor Hall rental donations, liability insurance costs and most recently, cover the cost of the Pennsylvania Historic Marker and the costs of the interpretive panels that will be installed at the St. Nicholas Memorial site.

## Honoring Veterans of St. Nicholas Croatian Catholic Parish N.S.



remember As veterans on Veterans Day, we ask that you keep our Veterans in your thoughts and prayers this November.

Over the past decades, our St. Nicholas North Side Parish has honored veterans in several ways. We installed a brass panel in the church vestibule near the Pieta, a panel that contains the names of those from the parish lost during



World War II. Today that plaque in honor of the men of the parish stands at the St. Nicholas Cemetery on Hahn Road east of Babcock Blvd. When the Lourdes Grotto was constructed from 1944-47, Mrs. Mary Crnkovic donated the

grotto altar in honor of her son Walter, the first member of the parish killed during the Second World War.



for the sacrifices they made and for their many contributions to America's victories over tyranny and oppression.


We respect them, we thank them, we honor them, and we are proud of them. We pray that you will watch over these people and




