PCHF Exploring Partnership with Senator John Heinz History Center



In early March, PCHF Board Members met with Andy Masich, President and C.E.O. of the Senator John Heinz History Center and members of his staff. We were given an opportunity to convey our ideas for a potential display in regard to St. Nicholas Croatian Church, North Side, the Mala Jaska neighborhood and Croatian culture.

We supplied their staff with a list of artifacts and a CD containing a collection of photographs of artifacts from St. Nicholas Church, as well as various Croatian artifacts. We discussed the possibility of the Heinz History Center taking over our archives.

Anne Madarasz, Vice-President of Museum Exhibits gave us a tour of a section of the History Center that houses specific cultural items and

stories that go with them. It seems like a display of St. Nicholas Church and related Croatian culture would fit well in that section. John Paul Deley, Director of Thomas & Katherine Detre Library & Archives gave a tour of the archive section that keeps books and other archival materials safe and secure. Viewing this section of the museum that is not normally available to the general public was a unique and enlightening experience.

Going forward, we hope that this will be the first of many meetings with the goal to designate the Senator John Heinz History Center as the official depository of our archives, artifacts from St. Nicholas Church, as well as the collection site for related objects, images and archival material related to Croatian immigration and life in this region.

American flags will be distributed to the attendees; a moving eulogy will be given; votive candles will be lit and the bell tolled as the names of each deceased veteran is called. The ceremony will close with the playing of Taps and the singing of "God Bless America" led by Bernice Goyak.

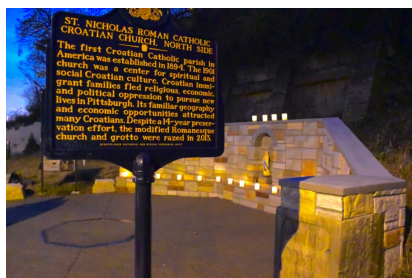
Note Cards of the New Our Lady of Lourdes Statue at Historic Site

If you've visited or driven by the St. Nicholas Church Historic Site, you may have seen the new statue of Our Lady of Lourdes. It is a beautiful and appropriate addition to the St. Nicholas Church Historic Site. A statue of Our Lady of Lourdes was sought after for several months. With visitors leaving holy cards of the Blessed Mother, as well as crucifixes and floral vases at the site, it was obvious that others were also interested in having some representation of St. Nicholas Church placed in the indented area of the seating wall at this historic site. Other statues of the Blessed Mother were explored, but there was always something that dissuaded PCHF Board members from purchasing any of those statues. When one of PCHF's members caught sight of the Lady of Lourdes statue in the Sacred Heart Religious storefront in Bloomfield, PA, it was obvious that this was the statue of Mary we'd been seeking. The emotion depicted in the eyes of the statue of the Blessed Virgin mimics a sadness that seems to reflect the long saga and fate of St. Nicholas Church, N.S. and the Grotto that were demolished by the Diocese. Made by a manufacturer just outside of Pittsburgh, this very precious statue arrived just in time for the feast day of Saint Nicholas, the patron saint of St. Nicholas Church, N.S. On the eve of December 6, the new statue of Our Lady of Lourdes was surrounded with luminarias, in memory of the luminarias that yearly graced the steps and Grotto of St. Nicholas Church, N.S., as had been part of the celebration of that day.

We believe that PCHF Co-chairman, Steve Willing, captured the solemnity of the new Lady of Lourdes statue in his photographs of the December 6 event. To share both the images from the 2015 candle light service and a photo of the original Grotto and Blessed Mother statute, the PCHF directed the creation of note cards. One can purchase these note cards via our website's store or by utilizing the enclosed order form. Other note cards of St. Nicholas Church's interior and exterior can be ordered from our website as well.

Luminaria Light up St. Nicholas Church Historic Site at Annual Candlelight Prayer Service

Faithful supporters of Saint Nicholas Croatian Church, N.S. gathered on December 6, 2015, the Feast Day of Saint Nicholas, as they have year after year on the exact spot where St. Nicholas Church, N.S. , once stood, honoring its memory and historical significance.



Over two dozen luminarias that were used at prior St. Nicholas vigil services shined brightly in memory of St. Nicholas Church. PCHF Co-chairman, Bill Vergot, dressed as Saint Nicholas, was in attendance waving to passing motorists on Route 28 as they honked their horns in support.

About a dozen passionate supporters gathered to pray and remember Saint Nicholas on his feast day.



PCHF Board member, Bernice Goyak, led the group in prayer and song. Silent Night was sung in both English and Croatian. A condensed history of Saint Nicholas, the Church's patron saint, was read by Susan Petrick. Co-chairman, Stephen Willing, read aloud Luke 1: 26-33, a biblical reflection of the Annunciation. Bernice Goyak then led the group in the Joyful Mystery of the Rosary, with Susan Petrick reciting Luke 2: 4-13, the Biblical reflection of the Nativity. The Croatian hymn, Radujte Se Narodi, closed out the solemn ceremony.

PCHF plans to continue this service each and



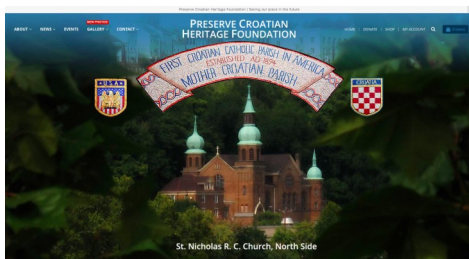
every year on this sacred ground. Please make plans to attend next year.

Church as the "First Croatian Catholic Parish in America — the Mother Croatian Parish".



A brochure with the Church's history and architecture, including the truth of why St. Nicholas was demolished, can easily be downloaded from the site as a keepsake. Copies of this brochure are freely available for visitors at the St. Nicholas Church Historic Site.

Other links in the website include: current news, PCHF newsletters, a store to purchase St. Nicholas merchandise, events calendar, a membership application and ways to donate, feasibility studies and news articles from 2000 to present. One of the main features of the new website is the collection of over 550 photographs displayed in the 15 different gallery albums — photos that have special meaning and bring back memories from our past. Saint Nicholas made his annual rounds handing out chocolate filled gold coins, and Darlene Harris, Pittsburgh City Councilwoman, District 1, stopped by to say hello.

Co-chairs, Bill Vergot and Stephen Willing, recapped the PCHF-related events of 2015 including the June 20 PA Historical Marker Dedication & Ribbon Cutting that took place at the St. Nicholas Church Historic Site. They explained that the historic site is visited regularly and invited the guests to encourage friends and family members to take the 10-minute walk from the Penn Brewery parking lot to the site or to make an even quicker trip by bicycle. The historic site walkway connects to both the North Shore trails, the 31st Street Bridge and the William Lieberth Memorial Pedestrian Bridge. Future plans of PCHF to have a plaque fabricated and installed at the children's area of the St. Nicholas Cemetery on Hahn Road was also given. This plaque would memorialize all of the children buried in the cemetery.

Three lucky winners took home door prizes from the St. Nicholas Banquet. The first prize was a framed print of St. Nicholas Church. The second was a framed print of Our Lady of Lourdes Grotto. The third prize was a brass Christmas tree ornament of St. Nicholas Church.

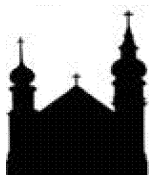

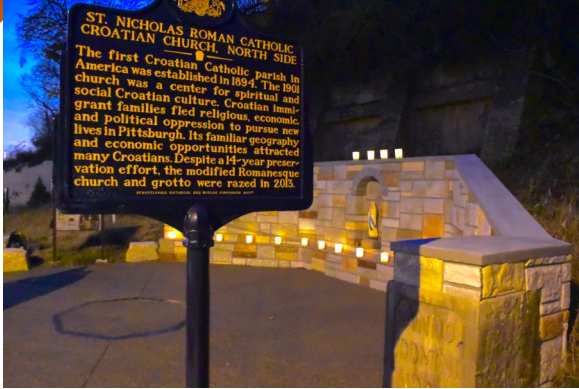

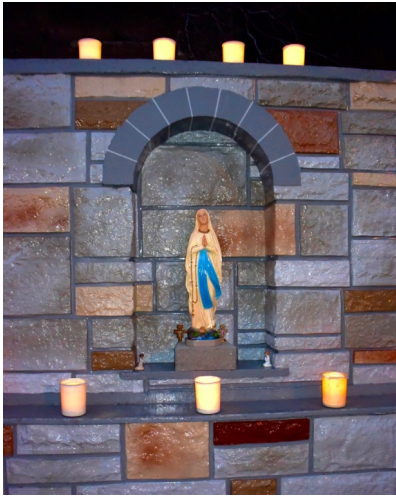
